Taken from an email from Mrs. Sue Shoger dated September 1, 2024 upon leaving Lithuania.

Yes, it's time to say goodbye. Frank and Emily returned Thursday afternoon. It's great to have them here with us for a few days.

We toured more on this trip with fewer students here . Their classes begin Sept.2,so many more are expected tomorrow in the evening English service. We spent a day with Merunas, a young man we met on our last two trips. He and his wife, Daniele, moved to Klaipeda in April, and their son was born July 2. Merunas works as an administrator for his father-in-law's addicts and homeless ministry. He gave us a tour of Old Town Klaipeda and Dverna Marina, where we climbed a tower for a view of the Curonian Spit. We also visited the Klaipeda District Evangelical Church, where his father-in-law preaches and his mother leads music. Their mission is based on Luke 14:21b 'Go out quickly to the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in the poor and crippled and blind and lame.' The church has housing for residents and plans to expand with 20 duplexes and a youth building. Several team members are former addicts who have found faith in Christ.

Lastly, we visited Trakai Castle, which is a 14th century brick castle, situated on Lake Galve. The structure fell into disrepair in the 17th century, was rebuilt in 1951, and in 1962, it became part of the Trakai History Museum. We had a kibinai lunch, which is pastries filled with minced beef, pork, chicken, or mutton, flavored with onions and various herbs.

But, we were here to serve, and we found a richness in Bible studies and fellowship times. We saw God providentially arrange those attending the Bible studies, offering more time for conversations and questions, and if an answer wasn't available at the moment, time to dig into the Word to seek the answer. Peter, who we mentioned last time, has moved to Vilnius. Frank says Peter's faith cycles between strong and weak. Pray that he stays in the "up cycle" and remains strong in his faith. Shekina is still dealing with grief, but we've had good conversations with her. She's a kind and tender-hearted young woman, now learning Lithuanian, which is required for her job at the hospital. Pray for God's continued comfort and encouragement for her.

Prayer Requests:

Frank and Emily as they prepare for the new students who will be invited to the Internat'l Service, and may God build up the Lithuanian congregation.. There are quite a few very sporadic attenders.

For Dainius as he starts his final Bible Institute semester and prepares to lead the Lithuanian congregation, while Frank leads the internat'l one and continues mentoring him.

For two men who married non-Christian wives. One man told Tom that life is challenging for them because they don't have agreement with their spouses in their marriages like Frank and Emily do. For the internat'l students as they return. May the ones who already attend the afternoon service return and others learn about it and join in.

It was a delight to have several days with Frank and Emily! Thank you so much for your prayers.
