ABOUT WHITE OAK ARP



The Confessional Teaching on 'Improving Our Baptism'

Larger Catechism Q. 167. HOW IS OUR BAPTISM TO BE IMPROVED BY US?

A. The needful but much neglected duty of improving our Baptism, is to be performed by us
all our life long,
especially in the time of temptation, and
when we are present at the administration of it to others;
by serious and thankful consideration of
the nature of it,
the ends for which Christ instituted it,
the privileges and benefits conferred and sealed thereby,
our solemn vow made therein;
by being humbled for
our sinful defilement,
our falling short of, and walking contrary to, the grace of baptism,
our engagements; by growing up to assurance of pardon of sin,
and of all other blessings sealed to us in that sacrament;
by drawing strength from
the death and resurrection of Christ, into whom we are baptized, for the mortifying of sin, and quickening of grace;
and by endeavoring to
live by faith,
to have our conversation in holiness and righteousness, as those that have therein given up their names to Christ;
and to walk in brotherly love, as being baptized by the same Spirit into one body.

Take a moment to recall the last time you observed a baptism. It was likely during a worship service. The pastor surely took time to remind the congregation of what baptism is and what it represents. Once the sacrament had been administered, the congregation may have responded with a promise or in some situations with applause. It was a special moment for the one being baptized and his or her family. But if you're a believer, it was intended to be special for you too.

Christians believe baptism is a means of grace for the one being baptized. What some do not realize is that baptism is also a means of grace for believers as they observe the baptism of others.

SEED Ministry – (update from Lee Shelnutt)

As you've no doubt heard, the Rwandan government started implementing the 2018 law that requires ministers to have an education and meet certain building codes for their church facilities. To date, nearly 10,000 churches and mosques have been closed by the government, and most of our students' churches have been in that number. As you might expect, our students and their congregations are scared and disoriented, as they make valiant efforts to bring their buildings up to code.

This tough challenge is now becoming a blessed opportunity to walk alongside our dear brethren, as this new reality unfolds and the Lord shakes and ultimately, strengthens His Church. During my trip to teach, I had the opportunity to preach to over 600 believers whose buildings have been closed but who have been allowed to meet in the auditorium of Reach the Children of Rwanda's Nyabihu Christian Academy. I and other team members have been able to encourage our brothers and sisters during these tough days. And, through the support of concerned donors, we are coming alongside four churches, financially assisting their efforts to meet code. One of those churches has now passed inspection and been reopened! Praise God!

As you see, these tough challenges are blessed and staggering opportunities. Pray the Lord would raise up at least two missionaries or missionary families to labor with us in Rwanda, deepening and furthering our work there.


